


#### Police Personnel Cost Survey

- PERF conducted a budget survey of 297 various sized Police Departments throughout the U.S.
- On average, it found that those police department's spent 85% of their annual budgets on personnel costs.
- The range of these percentages was from 61% to 98.5%.
- The Franklin County Regional P.D.'s proposed personnel costs are projected at 85%, or exactly at the national survey average.












### Officers per 1,000 Population in Pennsylvania

## Slate Belt Regional Police Department, Northampton County, PA

Established March, 2015 for Pen Argyl Borough, Wind Gap Borough & Plainfield Township Population 12,453 with 21 Full-Time Officers

- · DCED (via IACP Formula) estimated the annual incidents to be 6,849
- · In 2016, the actual reported incidents were 6,691 (-158 or -2%)
- · In 2015, DCED estimated the Cost per Officer to be \$107,700
- · In 2017, the actual Cost per Officer was \$114,285 (+6% over 3 years)
- From 2016 thru 2019, the total PD budget has increased only 3.35%
- · From 2016 thru 2018, the total grant amounts received was \$391,127

### Southern Chester County Regional Police Department

#### **Potential Grants for Future Cost Reductions**

- Various Federal and/or State Grants (Body & Car Cameras, Mobile Technology, etc.)
- PA Liquor Control Board Grants (DUI Patrols & Checkpoints, Underage Drinking, etc.)
- Private or Corporate Grants (MADD, SADD, Insurance Companies, Foundations, etc.)
- PA Department of Education Grants (SRO Positions, School Safety Training Programs)

- New "state of the art" 10,000 sf Police HQ for a \$58,000 annual budget payment (58%)
- Current PD space becomes additional Township office space (11 rooms with 1,820 sf)

#### Waynesboro Borough -

- "New" 30 Officer PD (20 Patrol, 4 Traffic, 4 Detectives, 4 Clerks, Faster Responses, New HQ, etc.)
- \$42,000 in Grant returns of +/- \$100,000 Anticipated (42% share of any grant money)
- New "state of the art" 10,000 sf Police HQ for a \$42,000 annual budget payment (42%)
- Current PD space becomes additional Borough office space (11 rooms; sf not provided)
- Reduced overall costs (-5%) when compared to the current Police Department budget



Zones 1-4: 6,300 +/- Pop. in Each; Average of 10 Calls/Day per Zone



### Summary of the Regional Police Department

- 30 Full-Time Officers including:
  - · 1 Chief
  - 1 Captain
  - 6 Sergeants
  - 16 Patrol Officers
  - 3 Traffic Officers
  - 3 Detectives
  - 4 Full-Time Clerical Staff



- 4 Patrol Zones with approximately 6,300 residents in each zone
- MINIMUM coverage by no less than 3 Patrol Officers at all times
- Assigned patrol zone coverage for all 42.3 square miles
- Full coverage and emergency response plans for all schools, etc.
- Increased response times to all calls for service
- 17 Police Vehicles (9 Marked & 8 Unmarked, with 5 being new)
- Standardized Uniforms, Cars, Equipment, Reports & Policies
- Eligibility for various State and/or Federal Grants
- Daily per Capita Cost of .53 per person
