

ORDINANCE NO. 969

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING STREETS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF WAYNESBORO AS SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES, RESTRICTING PARKING THEREON, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Waynesboro,

Section I. Definitions

- (a) Snow - any precipitation depositing any accumulation on the streets of the Borough of Waynesboro, including snow, sleet, hail, ice or freezing rain.
- (b) Snow Emergency - a state, declared as herein described under which highway conditions are hazardous and dangerous to the vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- (c) Snow Emergency Routes or Snow Routes - all streets within the Borough of Waynesboro, so designated and marked as hereinafter set forth.
- (d) Vehicles - all motor vehicles using Borough streets, including all public and private transportation conveyances, trucks and other powered vehicles.

Section II. Declaration of Snow and Ice Emergency.

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named in Section IV of this ordinance, the Mayor (and in his absence, the President of Council), at his discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (known as "Snow Emergency"). In addition, a declaration may be made when national or local weather forecasts call for an accumulation of 4" or more. Information of the declaration may be given by the Borough through radio, newspaper or other available media. Information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

Section III. Parking Prohibited, Driving Motor Vehicles Restricted, on Snow Emergency Routes During Emergency.

Within two (2) hours, after any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person to:

- (a) Park a motor vehicle or allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated in Section IV of this ordinance;
- (b) Any vehicle parked, stalled, incapable of moving under its own power, or left unattended upon any snow route may be removed or towed to any other location, in accordance with the provisions of the Vehicles Law of Pennsylvania, Title 75 of Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes.

Section IV. Snow Emergency Routes Designated.


The following are designated as snow emergency routes:

| <u>Street</u> | <u>Between</u> |
|----------------------------------|---|
| Main Street S. Potomac Street | Clayton Avenue and Fairview Avenue W. Main Street to Second Street |

Section V. Penalty for Violation.

- (a) If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under Section I of this ordinance, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50.00 plus costs.
