APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NO. 2021-12 APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF A BUDGET MODIFICATION TO THE FY 2018 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM: Mr. Stains explained the proposed modification to the CDBG Program Budget for FY 2018 as follows —

- Reduce the budget line item amount for Street Improvements for West Third Street from South Church Street to South Potomac Street by the amount of \$1,747.18 for a revised budget amount of \$39,888.82. The reconstruction work has been completed and there are no outstanding items to be paid. This line item may then be closed out.
- Delete the A.D.A. Improvements to the Borough Building. These improvements will be undertaken at a later date and will require further study, which will hold up the project beyond the FFY 2018 Contract Completion Date. The funds in the amount of \$82,722.00 to be reallocated to street improvement work on West Third Street.
- Delete the General Administration Line Item budget amount of \$27,298.00 and reallocate the funds to street improvement work on West Third Street.
- Create a new project activity, Street Improvements to West Third Street from Fairview Avenue to South Price Avenue in the amount of \$70,940.00. This will be a multi-year activity in conjunction with the FY 2018 CDBG Program Year.
- Create a new project activity, Street Improvements to another portion of West Third Street from Cleveland Avenue to Fairview Avenue in the amount of \$40,827.18. This will be a multi-year activity in conjunction with the FY 2020 CDBG Program Year.

APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION NO. 2021-13 AUTHORIZING OUTDOOR DINING AREAS AS A USE BY RIGHT IN THE TOWN CENTER (TC) DISTRICT, THE DOWNTOWN BUSINESS (DBD) DISTRICT, AND THE GENERAL COMMERCIAL/OFFICE (GC) DISTRICT, SUBJECT TO SPECIFIC USE CRITERIA: Mr. Stains noted that, in response to orders issued by Governor Wolf and the PA Department of Health regarding gathering and capacity limits for indoor and outdoor events, including mitigation measures specifically geared at restaurants, Borough Council would like to provide more outdoor dining area opportunities within the Borough during the Disaster Emergency to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

As the Borough's Zoning Ordinance currently allows outdoor dining areas as a use by special exception within the Downtown Business (DBD) District only, Council intends to consider an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to permit outdoor dining as a use by right within the Town Center (TC) District, the Downtown Business (DBD) District, and the General Commercial (GC) District, subject to the specific outdoor dining area regulatory criteria contained in the Zoning Ordinance, codified as Chapter 295 of the Code of the Borough of Waynesboro.

This proposed resolution states that the Borough does not intend to take enforcement actions against an outdoor dining area located within the Town Center (TC) District, the Downtown Business (DBD) District, and the General Commercial/Office (GC) District, during the Disaster Emergency unless such outdoor dining area shall fail to comply with the requirements of Section 295-54 (A-D) of the Zoning Ordinance. This Resolution does not suspend enforcement of other applicable Borough ordinances, nor does it relieve a property owner from complying with all applicable building code provisions and property maintenance code provisions.

The Waynesboro Planning Commission reviewed the proposed ordinance on 04/12 and recommended that Borough Council approve its advertisement for consideration.

REQUEST FROM SAINT ANDREW CATHOLIC SCHOOL TO USE MEMORIAL PARK FOR ANNUAL RACE FOR EDUCATION AND FIELD DAY EVENTS ON MAY 21, 2021 (RAIN DATE OF MAY 24, 2021) FROM 9:30 A.M. TO 2:00 P.M.: Mr. Stains presented this annual request, noting there have been no issues in the past with the event.

Councilman P. Fleagle made a motion for approval. Councilman J. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

REQUEST FROM THE INSTITUTE TO PROVIDE ENVIRONMENTAL LEARNING EXPERIENCES FOR ST. ANDREW CATHOLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS AT MEMORIAL PARK ON MAY 24, 2021 AND MAY 25, 2021 FROM 9:30 A.M. TO 2:30 P.M.: Mr. Stains noted that this request was presented to the Recreation Board, who recommended approval. He added that the public will still be able to use the park at these times.

Councilman J. Fleagle made a motion for approval. Councilman Knott seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

REQUEST FROM YMCA TO USE VOLLEYBALL COURTS AT NORTHSIDE AND MEMORIAL PARKS FOR THEIR SUMMER VOLLEYBALL LEAGUE FROM JUNE 7, 2021 TO AUGUST 19, 2021 (MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY, 6:30 P.M. TO 8:30 P.M.): Mr. Stains noted that this is an annual request, which has been recommended for approval by the Recreation Board.

Councilman Knott made a motion for approval. Councilman P. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

REQUEST FOR SUMMER JUBILEE FIRECRACKER 5K RACE ON JULY 3, 2021 BEGINNING AT 7:30 A.M. (KIDS' ONE MILE FUN RUN) AND 8:00 A.M. (5K RACE): Kevin Grubbs noted that this is an annual request. All required items have been submitted and the Street Committee is recommending approval.

Councilman Knott made a motion for approval. Councilman P. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

REQUEST FROM BROTHERS OF THE BRUSH, INC. FOR THE JULY 4<sup>TH</sup> PARADE ON JULY 3, 2021 BEGINNING AT 9:30 A.M.: Kevin Grubbs noted that this is also an annual request and the parade will follow the same route as in the past. The Street Committee has reviewed and approved this, contingent upon PENNDOT's approval for the permit. It was noted that the fireworks will be held the evening of 07/03 as well.

Councilman P. Fleagle made a motion for approval. Councilman J. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF LOT ADDITION PLAN (LUMINEST, INC.) FOR 246 W. SECOND STREET: Mr. Stains noted that this property was part of the Borough's aggressive blight enforcement program. In November of 2015, a remedial action agreement was entered into between the Borough of Waynesboro and Michael Knott (property owner). Little action was taken and a notice of violation was issued in January of 2016. In December of 2018, the property was deeded to the Borough of Waynesboro. As the Borough has spent a significant amount of tax dollars toward this property, they were quite pleased when Luminest entered into an agreement for purchase in December of 2020. As Luminest was seeking grant funding for their project, there have been some delays in the process.

Mr. Grubbs noted that Luminest, Inc. is proposing a lot addition to the rear of 246 W. Second Street to accommodate two (2) off-street parking areas on the property, which are required by ordinance. The lot addition consists of a 708.16 s.f. (0.0161 acres) area that was acquired from Renaissance 248, LLC. The Waynesboro Planning Commission is recommending approval.

Councilman P. Fleagle made a motion for approval. Councilman Knott seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

APPROVAL OF LAND DEVELOPMENT PLAN (LUMINEST, INC.) FOR REDEVELOPMENT OF 242 & 246 W. SECOND STREET: Mr. Grubbs presented a land development plan for the proposed demolition of the existing dwellings at 242 and 246 W. Second Street and the construction of two (2) new dwellings. The Waynesboro Planning Commission reviewed the plans and made the following suggestions to Luminest: (1) extending the length of the proposed parking areas by five (5) feet for a total length of 25 feet; and (2) connecting the downspouts for the roof drains to an underground drywell tank. The Waynesboro Planning Commission then recommended approval of the land development plan.

Councilman J. Fleagle made a motion for approval. Councilman Royer seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes,

Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

PROPOSAL FROM GLESSNER ALARM AND COMMUNICATIONS FOR SOUTH POTOMAC STREET FIRE STATION: Mr. Stains presented a proposal from Glessner Alarm and Communications for the S. Potomac Street Fire Station. This will upgrade the fire and carbon monoxide system to give more safety for the career staff who bunkin and work 24 hours/day, as well as the volunteers. The cost is \$5,028.00, which includes the necessary equipment for remote monitoring.

Councilman Cermak made a motion for approval. Councilman Knott seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

PROPOSAL FROM GLESSNER ALARM AND COMMUNICATIONS FOR TOLL GATE HOUSE: Mr. Stains presented another proposal from Glessner Alarm and Communications for the Toll Gate House, which is not currently open or rented but will be actively pursued in the near future. The cost is \$2,093.40.

Councilman Royer made a motion for approval. Councilman Cermak seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

EAT, SHOP, PLAY BANNER REQUEST FROM MAINSTREET WAYNESBORO, INC.: Mr. Stains presented a banner request from Mainstreet Waynesboro, Inc. for the downtown businesses' Eat, Shop, Play campaign from June to August. This will consist of 30-40 banners.

Councilman Knott made a motion for approval. Councilman J. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

On a similar matter, Councilman Royer commended Bill Kohler for his efforts in regard to the Community Theatre Project.

AUTHORIZE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION TO CONDUCT EXAMINATION FOR FIRE APPARATUS DRIVER: Mr. Stains advised that the current list of eligible candidates for the position of FT Fire Apparatus Driver is down to one (1) and Council accepted the resignation of one of the career staff earlier in this meeting. The Personnel Committee is recommending that the Civil Service Commission begin the examination process in the event that future vacancies occur.

Solicitor Wiser explained that the eligibility list expires one (1) year after the date of issuance, or if Council requests a new list, and the entire examination process begins again. If an individual on the list is still interested, he would start the application/examination process again and be ranked based on his new score. Further discussion and questions followed about the reasoning behind not hiring an individual who is on the current list, and Mr. Stains indicated that this is a personnel matter which should not be discussed publicly.

Councilman Knott made a motion for approval. Councilman J. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

# FOR INFORMATION ONLY

"HYBRID" COUNCIL MEETINGS TO BEGIN IN MAY: Mr. Stains noted that Council previously discussed beginning "hybrid" meetings in May if the COVID situation continued to improve. He explained that the Mayor and Council members, Borough Manager and Solicitor will be present in Council Chambers, however other staff members will participate via Zoom in Borough Hall or remotely. Members of the public will continue to attend via Zoom as well. He added that social distancing will be practiced in Council Chambers by those physically in attendance.

Mr. Stains will continue to monitor the situation to determine when meetings can return to "normal" and the public can attend in-person. He noted that equipment and software needed to accommodate these changes will cost several thousand dollars, but these costs are recoverable through the COVID funding authorized to the Borough of Waynesboro.

<u>COUNCIL AND STAFF COMMENTS:</u> Mr. Stains discussed an earmark request that GMS Funding Solutions is currently working on ... applications are due on 04/23 for a federal program for community project funding, and the Borough will be seeking \$1,000,000 for Northside Pool renovations.

Mr. Stains noted that there is some debris in the stream at Renfrew Park, adjacent to the Blue Heron Trail. Kevin Grubbs has been working with our contracted engineering firm to secure permission to proceed with removing the debris without a DEP permit. Workers must stay on the stream banks, but the Borough doesn't have equipment long enough to reach the items. Mr. Grubbs will reach out to local contractors to have the debris removed.

Mr. Stains also reported on the multimodal funding application submitted for street reconstruction projects. Requests totaling \$402,000,000 were made for available funds of \$48,000,000, and the Borough received word that they did not receive any funding in this round. They will be applying again for the next round of funding.

Mayor Starliper reported that the Fire Police assisted with the Easter Egg Hunt on 04/03; will be assisting Mont Alto Fire Department with their annual carnival, mega gun drawing and festival; and will be assisting with the upcoming parades on Memorial Day and July 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Council then adjourned to executive session at 9:01 p.m. They reconvened at 10:26 p.m.

ACTION TAKEN FOLLOWING EXECUTIVE SESSION: Councilman Cermak made a motion to ratify the Mutual Separation Agreement between the Borough of Waynesboro and Chad Rooney. Councilman P. Fleagle seconded. A roll call vote was as follows: Jon Fleagle – yes, Pat Fleagle – yes, Jarred Knott – yes, Dade Royer – yes, Michael Cermak – yes and C. Harold Mumma – yes. The motion passed unanimously.

Having no further business to discuss, Councilman P. Fleagle made a motion for adjournment at 10:27 p.m. Councilman Knott seconded; the motion passed unanimously.
